You are also worried about Russia spreading Communism West across Europe and a stronger Germany might be able to stop that spread.





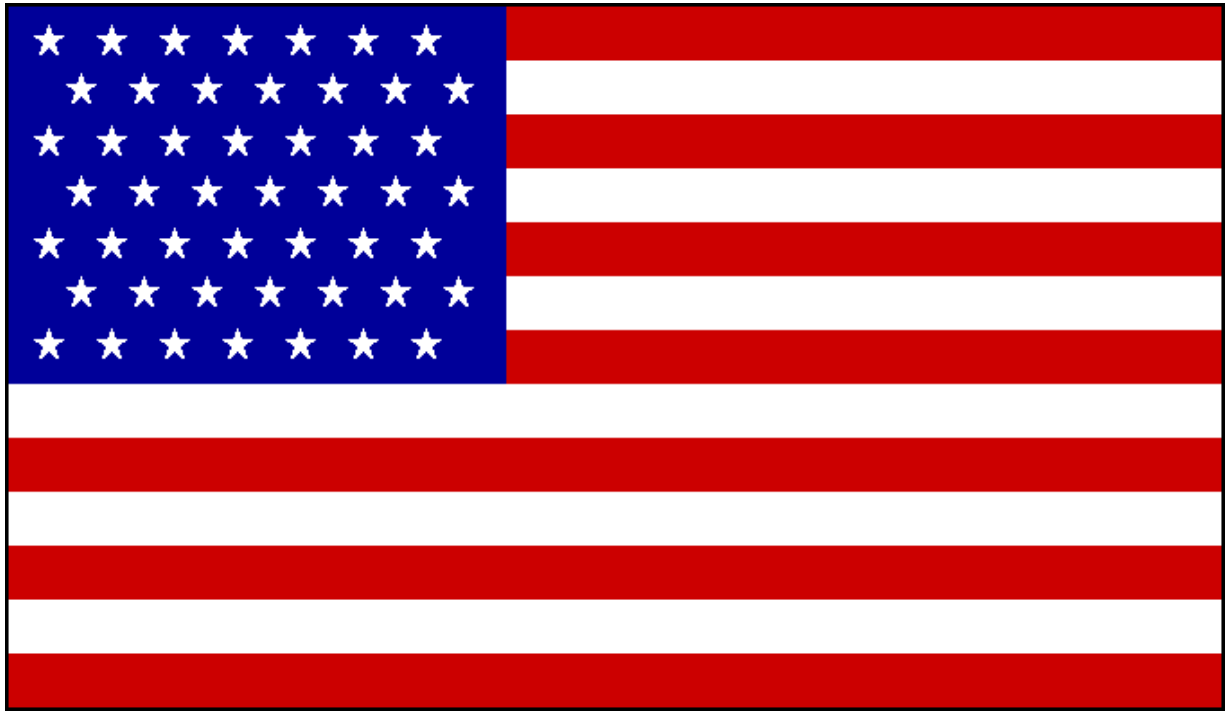
## France – Clemenceau (President)

You are also worried that Germany could attack you again as they are your neighbour.

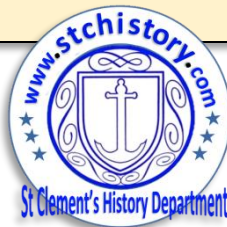




## USA – Wilson (President)
