





Scold's Bridle






TASK:


1 – no deterrent at all, pointless

5 – Amazing deterrent, would stop anyone committing a crime!

















Ordeal by Fire





Ordeal by fire

Step 1 The accused carries a red-hot iron bar for three steps, or takes a stone from the bottom of a pot of boiling water.

Step 2 The prisoner's hand is bandaged, and he returns to court three days later.

Verdict If the wound has healed, God must think the prisoner is worth helping because he is innocent. If the wound is infected, God must think the prisoner is not worth helping and so he must be guilty. He must be punished by being put to death.



Ordeal by water


Step 1 The accused is tied up.

Step 2 He is thrown into a lake or river.

Verdict Water is pure, just like God. If the prisoner floats, the water doesn't want him, nor does God. If God has rejected him, he must be guilty, and must be put to death. If the prisoner sinks and drowns, God must want him in heaven. He must be innocent.










Hanged, Drawn, Quartered


Treason (a crime against the king or country)
